Ebooks can be accessed and read in a web browser and, with reliable online access, are available 24 hours a day. Morling Library has two types of ebooks.

1. Purchased individual ebooks

These are owned and the records remain permanently in the Library catalogue. Owned titles have limited concurrent users: usually 1 or 3. A DVD case with a yellow cover sits on the library shelf to mark the place where a hardcopy of the book would be.

2. Subscription collection

The Library subscribes to a large collection of Religion ebooks (about 6,000). Most of these allow **unlimited** concurrent users. Books are added to and deleted from this collection from time to time.

The conditions under which an ebook is provided depend on a number of factors and vary from book to book: there are differences between the number of concurrent users, the format (EPUB or Adobe PDF), whether copy and paste is allowed, and the number of pages you can save or print.

Finding ebooks


Log on to EBSCOhost and search as you would for journal articles. Scroll down under Basic Search to access limiting fields for the ebook collection. At this time, ebooks can only be read online (not downloaded) so that they remain available for all students to access except when being actively used.

Using ebooks


- 1. Open the Library Catalogue (https://morling.softlinkhosting.com.au/liberty/libraryHome.do).
- 2. Use the link on the Library Catalogue page to access EBSCOhost in the same way as for databases. (You can think of the EBSCO ebook collection as another database.)
- 3. Log in to the EBSCOhost platform.
- 4. Click the 'Choose Databases' link at the top of the page.


5. On the Choose Databases pop-up box, tick *eBook Collection (EBSCOhost)* and *eBook Religion Collection (EBSCOhost)*. The first collection is the owned ebooks and the second collection is the subscription collection. Click *OK*.





6. Search for the ebook by title, author, keyword, etc. Click on the ebook's title.




7. Click on the 'EPUB (or Adobe PDF) Full Text link in the left column.





8. A screen reader window with page controls will open inside the browser window.



9. A Table of Contents displays in the left column.



10. You are now ready to read the ebook, either one page at a time or by navigating to a particular chapter or page number.
