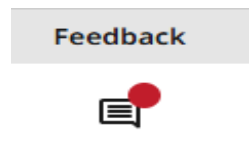


Reading Your Turnitin Feedback

To access your feedback, return to the ASSESSMENTS page of your Moodle unit and click on the link for the assessment task you submitted.

Step 1: Open your feedback

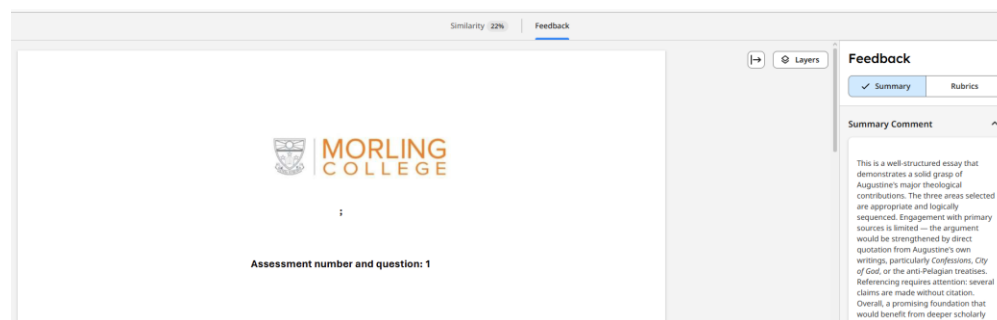
Scroll down to the Your work section. Your submission will be listed here. In the row showing your submission, click the speech bubble icon in the Feedback column.



Note: The Feedback icon will only become active once your lecturer has released your feedback. If the icon is not yet clickable, check the Feedback release date shown at the top of the page.

Step 2: View your feedback in Feedback Studio

Feedback Studio will open in a new browser tab. Select the Feedback tab at the top of the screen.



Your feedback appears in the right-hand panel. You may see any of the following:

- **Comments:** Notes your lecturer has attached to specific parts of your submission. They appear as cards with a speech bubble icon. Click a card to expand it and read the full comment.
- **QuickMarks:** Standard feedback labels applied to your submission. They appear as tags on the document and as cards in the right-hand panel, showing the QuickMark name and a brief description.
- **Summary Comment:** An overall comment about your submission, shown in the right-hand panel under the Summary sub-tab.

Step 3: Download your marked submission

You can download a copy of your marked submission with all feedback included. Select the Download icon at the top right of the screen to save a copy for your records.
